

Shakespeare in Action is fortunate to call Tkaronto/Toronto's Weston Community our home. We acknowledge that this is land that has been stewarded for millennia by the Annishnabeg, the Wendat, the Seneca, the Petun, the Mississaugas of the Credit River First Nation, and other nations both recorded and unrecorded. SIA's studio and offices are located right alongside the Humber River, Weston Road and the Kitchener Line. Precolonization, The Humber River was known to the Anishnabe as "Cobechenonk" which means "leave the canoes and go back"] and was also called "Niwa'ah Onega'gaih'ih" – "Little Thundering Water." This waterway ran parallel to the Carrying Place Trail and has been essential to human activity on this land for thousands of years and continues to be to this day.

#### Directors Note

The Snow Queen is a classic holiday-time fairytale that is deeply overshadowed by more popular holiday stories that are told, without fail, every year. In fact, one of my favourite go-to movies to watch every holiday is Jim Henson's A Muppet Christmas Carol- a timeless classic that really gives me all the holiday feels. With all that said, the SIA programming team knew we had to choose a story that somehow could encapsulate the holiday spirit much like Dickens' A Christmas Carol. Our eyes became set on Hans Christian Anderson's The Snow Queen.

What makes The Snow Queen an incredible holiday story to be re-told by children is the simple fact that it was made for children. It's a story that children have imagined themselves, and thus a story that they can really tell from their own creativity. It's not wholly out of a child's realm to talk with animals as they share secrets with their stuffed animals or to envision that they are on a quest when hiking with their family.

This story isn't a forewarning of the dangers of money and capitalism, but rather the strength of friendship and the love that lives in that place, as seen between Gerda and Kay. I also can't ignore that this story is about the relationship between humans and nature, with nature always supporting Gerda through her journey. At it's foundation this story is about caring for one another and the land we are in relation to always.
